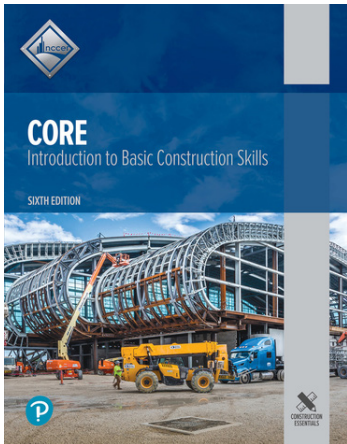


NCCER Core Construction Curriculum Certification



The National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) Core Curriculum is an excellent introduction to the trades. With modules covering essential construction industry topics, learners have the ability to receive training and show their skills both through written and performance based examinations. Upon completion of the training, learners receive a recognized industry credential, wallet card, and certificate of completion through the NCCER Registry.

Module topics include:

- Build Your Future in Construction
- Basic Safety
- Introduction to Construction Math
- Introduction to Hand Tools
- Introduction to Power Tools
- Introduction to Construction Drawings
- Introduction to Basic Rigging (optional)
- Basic Communication Skills
- Basic Employability Skills
- Introduction to Material Handling



How the Program Works:

- Teachers are certified by attending the online Instructor Certification Training Program (ICTP).
- Schools purchase textbooks for students and instructors.
- Each module has a competency computer-based test that the students need to pass with at least at 70%.
- Most modules have a performance test where students demonstrate ability to do the tasks.
- Instructors teach the curriculum within their classes. They give tests on their own and their own maintain records. At the end of the training, the materials are submitted to ABC of Wisconsin for review and completion.
- Students who fully pass all modules receive a certificate of completion.
- Completion of the NCCER Core Curriculum does qualify for Wisconsin Technical Incentive Grants.

**Please note: ABC of Wisconsin does charge a fee for both the instructor training and a per student administration fee, NCCER does charge for the computer-based exams.
